
BAILLIESTON POLICE OFFICE

Baillieston Police Office first opened in 1948 with the Sub divisional office being in Shettleston. Housed within Baillieston Police Office are Uniform Groups as well as Community Police Officers. The day to day responsibility for running of the office is entrusted to Section Inspector Eddie Keen. For policing purposes the Baillieston Police Office serves the communities of Baillieston, Broomhouse,

Carmyle, Mt. Vernon, Garrowhill and Barlanark. In total 4 Community Constables are allocated duty to the Barlanark area and are divided into two groups, each working alternate shifts. They are as follows:-

PROPERTY SERVICES UPDATE

VANDALISM

As you can see from the front page of this newsletter the Co-operative staff and Committee are working closely with the Police to combat the increasing instances of vandalism in the area

For the campaign against vandalism and antisocial behaviour to be truly successful, residents in the area must also be prepared to stand up and be counted. If you see something amiss - REPORT IT IMMEDIATELY to the Police. If the culprit is arrested and convicted the Co-operative will then take action against the tenancy of those involved.

Some residents have already started doing this and prevented further damage to an empty house by phoning and alerting staff regarding windows being broken by local children. This resulted in the parent of one of the children involved receiving a final warning. Remember vandalism isn't a victimless crime - YOU are paying for it - £20,000 in the last year or the equivalent of six new kitchens being fitted

RECHARGEABLE REPAIRS - REMINDER

As you will be aware, over the years, the Co-operative has been carrying out repairs, which are the responsibility of the tenant. Unfortunately we have been unable to recover the cost of these repairs; therefore, rechargeable repairs must be paid in advance of any works being carried out. Only in exceptional circumstances, i.e. emergencies this rule will be overlooked, but the cost must still be paid after work is complete.

When reporting such repairs, you will be informed of the cost and asked to pay or complete a declaration to pay, which must be adhered to.
