- When you call our office to report an issue with your boiler/central heating you will select **Option 1** and this will direct your call to City Technical who will organise your repair or book your service
- A new phone number to report repairs direct to City Technical Services that will allow you to report central heating repairs both during and out with of office hours - 0333 202 0708
- New engineers working in the area with different branding on their uniforms and vans
- Otherwise, the same level of service will be delivered
- The annual service of your boiler will be carried out by City Technical Services
- Please make sure to always ask for ID from anyone calling at your home to confirm they are who they say they are

WAYS TO PAY YOUR DENT.

We offer many different methods of payment. Rent is due by the 28th, and we will accept payments made right up to the last day of the month by prior arrangement.

Please note: We no longer accept cash at our office. Cash can be paid at the Post Office or at Paypoint outlets.

The following payment methods are available to all of our tenants and are designed to be easy, convenient and some can be done without you even having to leave the comfort of your home.

METHODS OF PAYMENT



To pay by Debit/Credit Card simply contact the office on **0141 771 7722**. If you wish to pay by direct debit, your Housing Officer will be happy to explain the procedure. Direct Debits can be set up online or over the phone. You can set your Direct Debit up for either weekly, fortnightly, four weekly or monthly payments from your bank account. By agreeing to allow Calvay HA to collect your rent from your bank account on a frequency set by you, you don't need to remember to make payments and we can even apply any annual rent changes for you.



To pay over the phone, simply call **0330 041 6497**. You will be asked to enter your 19-digit allpay.net account number, which is the long number shown on the front of your payment card. You will then enter your own debit card details and the amount you wish to pay and you will be given a reference number as proof of payment.



To pay using the allpay.net Online Payments Service, simply log onto **www.allpayments.net** and follow the on-line instructions or download the payment app.



To make a card payment over the phone you can contact the office on **0141 771 7722**.




Payment can be made using your rent payment card at any Post Office or any outlet where you see the Paypoint sign.

Did you know that you can now report repairs online day or night, 365 days a year. Calvay now has an online repairs picker, which tenants can use to report repairs at their convenience. This means no waiting in telephone queues or having to come out in the cold winter weather to our offices.

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We weed your Help!

Insulation Works almost completed

We are delighted with the progress we have made in insulating our homes on Calvay Crescent, Calvay Road and Barlanark Road as we near the end of this project. This programme is expected to finish by mid July 2025, however, there are still properties our contractor Procast, must access.

Some residents are still to agree a date to allow the changing of their gas flue. This is essential as part of the new building works.

Every property also requires adequate ventilation. For some, this means the installation of new fans. This will include any kitchens and/or bathrooms which previously did not have any fans. Without adequate ventilation the risk of dampness and mould which can be dangerous to your health is raised considerably.

PRIVACY VS SECURITY:

The Battle Over Doorbell Recordings

As CCTV cameras, Ring doorbells and smart phones have become more affordable and accessible, Calvay has seen a significant increase in people using them within our developments. Along with this we have also had an increased number of complaints regarding properties within common areas that have these doorbells and neighbour disputes over the recordings.

Although use of these devices can be one possible solution to crime reduction, the owner must ensure they are following the principles of General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Calvay Housing has liaised with Police Scotland for advice and guidance on how to proceed with complaints regarding recording devices. Police Scotland can only deal with any issues that are a clear criminal offence. Otherwise, it is a civil matter and the best person to speak to is a solicitor or the ICO (Information Commissioners Office).



Calvay cannot take forward any complaints regarding CCTV, ring doorbells or neighbours filming on their phones unless it has been corroborated as a criminal offence by Police Scotland.

April 2024 to March 2025

With thanks to funding, donations, external partners, volunteers and participants, we had another great year at the Calvay Centre. Let's have a look at some of the highlights and fantastic achievements:

- Over 2300 free hot meals and snacks provided to school age children through the holiday food programme that ensured they had access to at least one hot meal/snack per day during school holidays
- Over 700 people attended our annual fun community day last year
- "IT for Me" pilot project: 100 members of the community have been supported to make the most of their devices and keep safe online
- 43 accredited certificates achieved, including Glasgow Life PC passport and Glasgow Kelvin College First Aid and Elementary food Hygiene (REHIS)
- 113 informal certificates achieved through Glasgow Life's Getting started in

IT and Glasgow Kelvin College courses in Employability, Cookery, Yoga and Wellbeing Course, Mental Health First Aid, Foundation DJ and Karaoke Course, Nail & Art Gel Course, Digital Photography, Beauty and Safeguarding. These courses have been a great stepping stone to college part time or full-time courses. Provision of a creche has supported parents to take part in courses

- 45 families benefited from 135 free back to school free uniforms

The Wider Role Team is always looking at ways that we can develop the Calvay Centre for the benefit of the local community. We currently work in partnership with Glasgow Life and Glasgow Kelvin College who deliver courses at the Centre along with our successful "IT for Me" project delivered by Fuse. They help support families, young people from **Greyfriars Church Youth Project and** seniors make the most of their own devices, whilst keeping people safe online.

The Barlanark Partnership consists of: The Calvay Centre, Fuse, Glasgow Kelvin College, Glasgow Life, Thriving Places, Greyfriars Church Youth Project, The Pavilion and Barlanark Community Centre. The Barlanark Partnership has a new Facebook page where you can access what's on in your local area and our up and coming activities.

Community Courses

The Calvay Centre delivers Community Based **Learning Courses** for all members of the local and wider community. Over the years we have worked in partnership with learning providers such as Glasgow Kelvin College, Glasgow Life, and private companies. The purpose of the Learning & Training Opportunities is to provide opportunities for community participants to develop new skills, have new experiences, enhance existing skills and knowledge, and to upskill their knowledge so that they can progress in the workplace and or move into further or higher education. To date we have facilitated local participants gaining over 100 recognised sector-based certificates / qualifications, and gaining over 300 certificates of attendance, participation and course completion.

Creche Provision

Thanks to funding from **Gem Workspaces Ltd** we have been able to put on a creche at each of our Community Based Learning Courses removing a 'Barrier to Participation' and enabling people with childcare needs to participate in learning & Training Opportunities knowing that their child(ren) are close by in a safe friendly environment with qualified experienced childcare practitioners.

Thanks to funding from **East Centre (Ward 18) Area Partnership** we will be able to continue with our successful **Baby & Toddler Sessions** on a Monday Afternoon: 1pm – 2.30pm and Thursday Morning: 10.30am – 12pm. These sessions are free to attend, and to date over 100 families have benefited from these informative, developmental, and interactive sessions that assist both children and parents to build positive experiences.


Since starting our Community Meals in 2023, we have been able to provide over 1500 <u>free</u> 3 course meals to families and individuals, all of which have had a great time and experience.

Holiday Food & Activity Programme KIDS EAT FREE

The Calvay Community always ensures that the community comes first especially school age children, therefore Calvay Housing Association Ltd, The Calvay Centre, Calvay Community Café, and The Calvay Community Events Committee have come together to ensure that no school age child goes without access to food during the school holidays.

Over the past year this partnership has made sure that all school age children in the area have had access to at least one hot meal / snack during the school breaks (Monday – Friday). During this time, we have **served up over 2800 hot meals / snacks to school age children**, many of whom may have gone hungry if it were not for this initiative.

In addition to the hot meals and snacks, the Calvay Community Events Committee facilitated many activities/events for school age children & families throughout the school breaks, as we knew that these would help the families and alleviate the boredom for the children.

Carer Support Payment

Carer Support Payment is money to help you if you're a carer. You can get paid £83.30 a week if you're eligible.

Carer Support Payment became available across Scotland from November 2024. This benefit replaces Carer's Allowance in Scotland.

You cannot get Carer Support Payment and Carer's Allowance at the same time.

If you get Carer's Allowance and live in Scotland, you do not need to apply for Carer Support Payment. Your benefit will move to Carer Support Payment. This is happened between February 2024 and Spring 2025.

Carer's Allowance Supplement is an extra payment for people in Scotland who get Carer Support Payment or Carer's Allowance on a particular date.

Carer's Allowance Supplement is paid 2 times a year.

June 2025 payment

The next payment will be £293.50 from June 2025. You'll get this payment if you were getting Carer Support Payment or Carer's Allowance on 14 April 2025. If you're due to get a payment, you'll get a letter

from Social Security Scotland before the payment is made.

December 2025 payment

This payment will be £293.50 from December 2025. You'll get this payment if you're getting Carer Support Payment or Carer's Allowance on 13 October 2025. If you're due to get a payment, you'll get a letter from Social Security Scotland before the payment is made.

Social Security Scotland

Social Security Scotland pays Carer's Allowance Supplement and Carer Support Payment.

Carer Support Payment

Carer Support Payment has replaced Carer's Allowance for carers in Scotland.

From 2024, carers who get Carer Support Payment will also get Carer's Allowance Supplement. You do not need to apply for it.

BEST START GRANT

If you are a woman on a qualifying benefit, you can claim Best Start Foods as soon as they know you are pregnant and can continue to be paid until a child is three years old.

Best Start Foods provides:

- £21.60 every four weeks throughout pregnancy
- £43.20 every four weeks from birth until a child turns one or reaches the first anniversary of its estimated delivery date, whichever is later
- £21.60 every four weeks from one until a child turns three.

Best Start Grant Pregnancy and Baby Payment helps with the costs of being pregnant and having a baby. People can apply for the payment from the end of the 24th week of pregnancy up until 6 months after the baby is born. Pregnancy and Baby Payment is £767.50 for the first child and £383.75 for a second child and any more after that.

NEW CLAIMS FOR PENSION AGE DISABILITY PAYMENT CAN NOW BE MADE ACROSS THE WHOLE OF SCOTLAND

Pension Age Disability Payment is the Scottish Government's replacement for DWP's Attendance Allowance for eligible customers living in Scotland.

New Claims for Pension Age Disability Payment have been accepted in pilot local authority areas since 21 October 2024. From 22 April 2025 the Scottish Government has expanded this coverage to the whole of Scotland.

All eligible customers living in Scotland will now make a new claim to Pension Age Disability Payment instead of Attendance Allowance.

Customers living in Scotland and already receiving Attendance Allowance do not need to take any action. They will have their claims transferred to Pension Age Disability Payment by the end of 2025.

Transfer of Disability Living Allowance claims to Scottish Adult Disability Living Allowance

From 24 March 2025, the remaining Disability Living Allowance claims for customers aged 18 or over and living in Scotland started to transfer to Social Security Scotland.

Social Security Scotland will pay Scottish Adult Disability Living Allowance.

All Disability Living Allowance claims will be transferred to Social Security Scotland by the end of 2025.

Customers do not need to take any action to start the transfer but must continue to report any change in circumstances to DWP until their claim is fully transferred. DWP will send customers a letter when their Disability Living







Following the recent change to our Gas Service Contractor, the options have now changed when you call our office.

The options are now as follows:

Option 1 - CITY TECHNICAL SERVICES

Option 2 - to report a repair

Option 3 – to make a payment over the phone towards rent, rechargeable repairs, factoring fees or garden maintenance.

Option 4 - to discuss your housing application

Option 5 – to speak to your Housing Officer directly.

Option 6 – for any other queries such as making an appointment with the Welfare Rights Officer or to speak to a member of the Corporate Services or Wider Role teams.

Please ensure you select the correct extension.

HOUSE FIRE WARNING AFTER E-SCOOTER BATTERY EXPLODES AT SCOTS HOME

House fires involving rechargeable electrical devices such as vapes, laptops and e-bikes are on the rise.

Statistics released by the Scottish Fire and Rescue Service (SFRS) show that there were at least 26 fires involving devices powered by rechargeable batteries recorded in Scotland last year. This compares to just three incidents in 2018.

Rechargeable batteries contain lithium-ion and are found in lots of household items, including mobile phones, laptops and vapes, as well as larger products like e-bikes, e-scooters and hoverboards.

If damaged, faulty or if improperly used, the batteries can catch fire, and in some cases cause explosions and the release of toxic fumes.



TAMPERING WITH UTILITY METERS: A RECIPE FOR DISASTER

Tampering with utility meters is dangerous and illegal. Under **no circumstances** should you tamper with the utility meters in your home.

Risks include: **Electric Shock**, **Burns**, **Electrical Fires** & **Gas Explosions**.

You not only put your own life in danger, but your family and neighbours too!

If you believe there is a fault or problem with the meter, you should report it as a matter of urgency to your utility supplier for urgent attention.

If you are found to have altered a meter within the property, it will result in possible legal action to recover your tenancy. Your utility supplier may take further action resulting in criminal prosecution.

WATER TANK SURVEYS AND DISCONNECTIONS

Last year Calvay started a project to disconnect our properties from cold water storage tanks and put all outlets onto a mains supply.

"Why?"

In the past, cold-water storage tanks were found in most properties. Usually kept within attics and lofts, these tanks supplied water to cold water taps and to hot water cylinders. With the move to gas central heating most properties are now typically mains fed, however, some outlets such as toilets and bathroom sinks were often left on the tanks. The tanks come with maintenance responsibilities, which are costly to deliver and time consuming for staff. There is also an increased risk of legionella and contamination, particularly during summer months when the warmer weather starts and temperatures rise. By disconnecting these tanks, we significantly remove the risk of legionella as the water comes direct from the mains supply.

"How?"

Our contractor will survey your property, including the loft, to determine what outlets are still connected to the tank. During the same visit it should be possible to disconnect from the tank and connect to the mains supply. The disturbance to your property is minimal as the disconnection takes place in the loft space. The tank will be left in place but drained down.

"Is this Necessary?"

Yes. You are expected to allow access for your property to be converted to mains supply. This work means you will be safer in your home, particularly if you are elderly, have children or an underlying health condition. If we are unable to arrange access with you, we may have to eventually force access to your property to do this work. This only applies to properties built before 2000.

"How to arrange a survey?"

Many properties have already been disconnected and have significantly reduced the risk to themselves and their family. If you are still to be surveyed or want to check if you require a survey, then please contact the office. The best way to do this is via email, repairs@calvay.org.uk

LEGIONELLA

What is Legionella?

Legionella is a bacteria that can live in domestic hot and cold water pipes and tanks. The bacteria can survive and grow rapidly at temperatures between 20 and 45 degrees celsius. Higher temperatures kill the bacteria. Legionnaires Disease is a pneumonia-like illness caused by this bacteria. Although the risk of legionella being present in frequently-used domestic hot and cold water systems is not as high as in larger-scale water systems, it should not be ignored.

How can Legionnaires Disease be caught?

Legionnaires Disease is caused by breathing in water droplets or spray-mists which have been contaminated by the legionella bacteria. Those most at risk include elderly people, smokers and those suffering from long-term illnesses. It cannot be contracted through drinking contaminated water and cannot be passed from person to person.

What can YOU do to reduce the risk from Legionella?

If your house has a hot water tank, make sure that the water temperature is set at a minimum of 60 degrees Celsius on the tank thermostat. If you need help or advice on this please contact us. Regularly run all cold water taps for at least 2 minutes to flush them out. For hot water taps and showers, make sure they run at full temperature for at least 2 minutes. For taps used less often, this should be done weekly. Regularly clean your shower head and hose (if you have one) with a mild disinfectant solution. If your house is going to be unoccupied for more than two weeks at any time (particularly in the summer) drain down your water system and refill it on your return. If you need help or advice on doing this please contact us in advance of your holiday. By following these basic rules you will minimise any risk to you and those in your household from Legionella.
