

CHECK YOUR RENT ONLINE

Last issue we told you about the new facility on our website which lets tenants look up their most recent rent and repairs history. If you've not tried it yet, go to our website www.calvay.org.uk, click on the Tenant Register/Log In button and register for an account.

Once we've carried out the necessary security checks and made your account live, you'll be able to log in at any time to see your last six rent and repairs transactions.

Please note, when you register, you must include your full name and address where prompted, otherwise we won't know who you are! You'll also be asked for your tenant number. If you don't know this, please just put in any four digits to allow you to continue with the registration process.

Remember - you must be the tenant or joint tenant of the property, and using your own email address.

TELL US WHAT YOU THINK

Consultation with our tenants is important, as we want to know your views on certain issues before we make a decision which directly affects you. We've currently got two areas where we'd like to know what you think. We've summarised these below, but you'll find more detail in the enclosed information leaflet.

Annual Rent Review - 2019/2020

Each year Calvay consults with tenants and sharing owners on our rent charges and any proposed increase.

Our aims are to:

- keep rents at an affordable level
- achieve the commitments in our Business Plan
- continue to deliver quality services that meet our tenants' needs.

As rent is our main source of income, we need to get the level right to make sure we can:

- meet the costs of managing, maintaining and improving your home and paying for services
- cover our costs including office overheads, bank charges, and payments on existing or new loans to build and improve our stock.

The enclosed information leaflet provides more detail about the proposed levels of increase this year and what we hope to achieve next year, based on these proposals. Please take a few minutes to read it and return the questionnaire, also enclosed.

Calling all ex-GHA Tenants and Owners - Calvay can make your area look better!

As you might already know, GCC own and 'maintain' various bits of common ground across all ex-GHA areas, where the properties are now owned or factored by Calvay. GCC have now approached all housing associations in Glasgow offering to gift these areas to us, as long as we take over their maintenance.

Here's what the difference would be:

Picture 1 shows Blyth Place common area after GCC has cut it - they now do what they call a 'peripheral cut', which means they cut round the edges and leave the middle area as it is.



Picture 2 shows the same area after Calvay's contractors have given it a one-off cut. It's not hard to spot the difference!

We're willing to take over the maintenance of all common ground, as suggested by GCC, as clearly we could make the overall area look much better. However,



we'd need to build the extra maintenance costs into our budget. We'd also need to pass on a small charge to our factored owners, although we've had some quotes and this would be very small.

When Geraldine joined Calvay as a Receptionist way back in 1998, she never imagined for a minute the journey she would take over the course of the next 20 years. Here our ever-enthusiastic Property Services Officer tells us a bit more about working hard, winning awards and looking out for snakes!

So Geraldine, first joining as Receptionist, now Property Services Officer – has much happened in between?

Plenty! While working on Reception, I was given the opportunity to go to college on day release to complete an HNC in Housing. I then went on day release to Stirling University and did an HND. After that, I moved to the Property Services department as a Property Services Assistant.

What does your current job involve?

Because we're a small community based organisation, we can offer a more personal service. Tenants know us all very well and feel comfortable coming to us for help.

What do you enjoy most about your job?

Each day is different and when you go into work in the morning, you never quite know how your day is going to turn out. The best thing about my job is being able to help tenants and applicants. Allocating a property to someone and knowing it's going to change their life is so rewarding.

To celebrate Geraldine's 20th anniversary with Calvay, she received a gorgeous bouquet of flowers from the staff team. Geraldine has been an inspiration to us all over the years and we look forward to working with her for many more to come.

I also really like helping people to sort out their arrears. I meet many people who are so worried about their debts, that they feel they can never get back on track. But there's always an answer. Together we work out a plan and make it easier for tenants to budget.

Do you have a personal motto?

To expect the unexpected! In my many years of home visits, I've found myself in lots of 'interesting' situations – most of which can't be printed! However, I was once asked by a tenant to look out for the family snake which had gone missing. It was the quickest inspection I've ever done!

What do you like to do in your spare time?

I'm a working mum so when I get time off I like to spend it with family and friends. Family is very important to me - I come from a close family and spend a lot of time with my son and nephews. I also enjoy swimming and gardening.

Ways to pay

Calvay currently accepts cash for rent and other payments at the office. However, we're continuing to reduce the amount of cash we take in here and are encouraging everyone to use a safer method.

If you still want to pay cash, please consider using your rent payment card at a PayPoint outlet instead of the office. Local PayPoint outlets include:

- the shop on Calvay Road (attached to the Calvay Centre) – open til 7pm
- the Co-op on Hallhill Road open til 10pm.

If you need a rent payment card to use at a PayPoint outlet, please contact us and we'll send you one out.

Here are three better ways to pay:

1. Debit/Credit Cards

We'll continue to take debit/credit card payments at the office. This is a safer way to pay if you want to make a payment by coming into the office. Please pop in during office hours (9am to 5pm, Mon to Fri) and we'll be pleased to take your payment. We also take card payments over the phone, just give us a call on **0141 771 7722.**

2. Online

You can pay online 24 hours a day using Allpay at https://www.allpayments.net



3. Direct Debit

If you want to take the hassle out of paying your rent, why not consider paying by Direct Debit? Direct Debits are a safe and easy way to pay, and come with a guarantee so you're automatically protected by three important safeguards:

- An immediate money back guarantee from your bank in the event of an error in the payment of your Direct Debit.
- Advance notice if the date or amount changes.
- The right to cancel at any time.

Just phone up or call into the office if you want a Direct Debit Mandate form or help setting up your Direct Debit.

Don't get caught out by court expenses

At Calvay we only take legal action for arrears recovery as a last resort. However, there are times when it's simply unavoidable. When going to court, we request decree for repossession, arrears recovery and court expenses. The Sheriff often grants the three requests at the hearing, but sometimes we request the case be dismissed with court expenses.

This means added costs to you - expenses can range from around £350 to over £2,000. A recent case cost £2,205, which the tenant is now responsible for paying. This expense is double the original rent arrears amount due. The only sure way to avoid court costs is to avoid us taking you to court in the first place.

or have a change of circumstances, then notify the office as soon as possible. Our Welfare Rights Officer, Dawn Kane, is always here to help you as well, so please don't sit and worry...talk to us.





Universal Credit – what this means for you

In October we held a Universal Credit Information Event in the Calvay Centre to help explain how UC will affect you. Representatives from Home Energy Scotland and Glasgow Homeless Network came along.

Here are 6 things you need to know about UC:

- If you're aged between 18-65 years, Universal Credit will replace new claims for: Income Support, Income Related Employment Support Allowance, Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance, Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit and Housing Benefit.
- 2. If you're making a new claim for any of these benefits on or after 5th December 2018, you'll need to claim Universal Credit.
- 3. If you're reporting a change in circumstances for any of these benefits on or after 5th December 2018, you'll also be expected claim UC.
- With UC, all claims are made online at www.gov.uk/ apply-universal-credit.
 If you can't claim online, call the Helpline on 0800 328 5644 for more information on how to do so.
- 5. The first payment of UC will be made 5 weeks after you claim. If you can't wait for the first payment, you can ask for a Short Term Advance, when you're making the claim or any time before you receive the first payment. This is a DWP loan and you'll be expected to pay this back over 12 months repayment will begin with your first UC payment.
- 6. If you claim UC, Housing Benefit will no longer be paid to your landlord. Your housing costs are included in your UC payment and YOU are responsible for paying your rent direct to your Landlord. There is no other help available if you do not pay your rent and fall into arrears.

Crisis Grants at Christmas

Crisis Grants are available over the festive period to people who have experienced:

- a 'disaster' like a fire or a flood.
- an 'emergency' such as when money is lost or stolen.

To apply for a Crisis Grant:

- phone the Scottish Welfare Fund on 0141 276 1177 and select option 1.
 - (Phonelines are open Monday to Friday, 9am to 5pm)
- apply online on the Glasgow City Council website www.glasgow.gov.uk

You should receive a decision within 24 hours so make sure you check your phone regularly.



ho-home safety:

Winter Warnings...

Christmas is a time for fun and celebration, but it's also when people are more at risk from house fires. So here are a few tips for your ho-

- Always switch off your tree lights and any other electrical decorations BEFORE you leave the house and BEFORE you go to bed.
- tree or furnishings, and don't leave lit candles unattended. Keep matches, lighters and candles out of children's reach.
- Don't overload electrical sockets.
- care in the kitchen.



Smoke Alarms

Smoke alarms save lives, so remember to test yours and make sure it's working. Although your alarm works off the mains supply, if there's a power cut, the battery is your backup. So make sure the battery you've got in your smoke alarm still works.

The Fire Service has also informed us that smoke alarms go off if power cards run out and there's no battery installed. So if you're going to be away from home for any length of time, please ensure that:







Winter weather can cause havoc to your home with frozen and burst pipes. This can cause a huge amount of damage and distress for you, your family and your neighbours.

Here's how to reduce your risk and what to do if the worst happens:

Keep your house warm

The best way to avoid burst or frozen pipes is to keep your home reasonably warm day and night. During particularly cold snaps, keep the heating on during the night at a low temperature.

If your water supply does become frozen:

- IMMEDIATELY turn off the water at the mains stop valve (this is generally located at the incoming supply pipe to your home, usually in the kitchen area).
- Open all COLD taps to drain the system (remember to close them again when you're finished).
- Do NOT open the hot taps as the hot water cylinder might collapse if the pipes feeding it are frozen.
- Turn off the central heating and immersion heater.
- Collect water in the bath for washing and WC flushing

 or ask family, friends or neighbours if you can use
 their facilities.

If you do get a burst pipe:

- IMMEDIATELY turn off the water at the mains stop valve (this is generally located at the incoming supply pipe to your home, usually in the kitchen area).
- Switch off the electricity at the mains.
- · Switch off any water heater.
- Turn off the central heating system.
- Open all taps to drain your system (remember to close them again when you're finished).
- Collect water in your bath for washing and WC flushing.
- Warn your neighbours who may suffer damage as a result.

If you're going away, make sure you leave an emergency contact number with a neighbour.

Glasgow City Council have advised us they'll be suspending their bulk uplift service during the festive period. However, no dates had been confirmed at the time of going to print, so please visit their website at www.glasgow.gov.uk to clarify the dates.

The Council have also told us the free disposal service at the Queenslie Depot is open as normal throughout the holiday, should you wish to dump bulky items yourself. We've arranged with our contractors to assist with this. Bulk items need to be left at the bin store area and will be uplifted by our contractor, Clyde Valley (closes only). Arrangements for houses remain the same, the occupier should contact 0141 287 9700 to arrange uplift.
